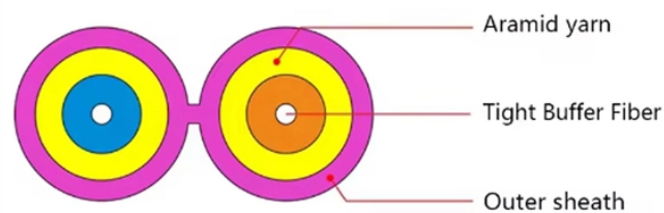


Bhutan Trapezoidal Bridge



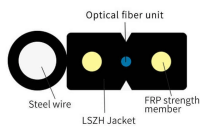
Overview

Spanning approximately 160 meters, this swaying footbridge connects the Punakha Dzong to the nearby villages and walking trails, offering breathtaking views and a taste of adventure. This is a list of bridges and viaducts in Bhutan, including those for pedestrians and vehicular traffic. Cantilever beams were developed in order to cross increasingly wide streams or rivers, where simple wooden beams had a limited range of about 10 meters. 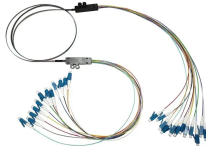
