Infield installations, splicing is a faster and more efficient method and is used to restore fiber optic cables when a buried cable is accidentally severed. Both methods provide much lower insertion loss compared to fiber connectors.

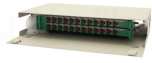

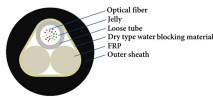

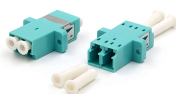
