

How are the network cabinets in Mozambique



Overview

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Mozambique has a comparatively low Internet penetration rate with only 4.8% of the population having access to the Internet compared to 16% for Africa as a whole.

There are now three international subsea cables landing in Mozambique, SEACOM and EASSy landing in Maputo, and 2Africa landing in both Maputo and Nacala.
