A common question we receive is: How do you use a fiber-optic termination box?

We recommend using a termination box if you're ordering an assembly with more than two strands. It functions as a junction between the incoming fiber cable and the outgoing customer-side fiber cable, where one fiber can be spliced, patched. This challenge is addressed by a fundamental piece of network infrastructure: the Fiber Termination Box (FTB).

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How to Use the FTB? A Step-by-Step Tutorial. The simplest way with pre-terminated cables: For installation, you'll only need the FTB, pre-terminated cables and some cable ties.

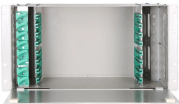
