Overview

Yes, a bedroom is an allowed location for an electrical panel. When the panel is placed in the bedroom, the electrician usually puts it in the area behind the door swing. It contains the circuit breakers that protect the wiring and appliances from overcurrent. 26 requires electrical equipment (including electrical panels) to be located to provide required working clearances about the equipment.



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Clearance: Electrical panels must be installed in a readily accessible area with a minimum clearance of 30 inches (762 mm) wide, 3 ft (36 inches or 914 mm) deep, and 6.5 feet (\approx 2 meter) high in front of ...



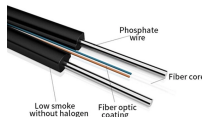
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A wall switch must be placed beside the entry door so you can light the room with a ceiling light, wall light, or lamp upon entry. An entryway ceiling light fixture must be controlled by a wall ...



While uncommon in modern construction, panels are sometimes found in bedrooms in older homes or due to specific renovation layouts. The location of this distribution hub is governed by ...



Don't place any locks on the door to your electrical panel or the room housing the electrical panel. If you have an outdoor electrical panel, ensure it's free of snow and debris. Make ...



While having an electrical panel in your bedroom is not prohibited, you will be safe only if you maintain the required clearance from the breaker box. However, due to health hazards linked with the ...

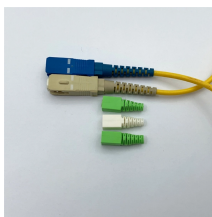
Is it a code violation if you place an electrical panel behind a door in a bedroom? I would assume it would not be good practice but I can not find anything specific in the NEC to prohibit this.

Electrical equipment must have a minimum 30" wide clear working space laterally in front of the equipment. This does not have to be centered on the equipment, but the electrical panel door ...
