

Where should pigtails be laid

Or do I need to have 6" coming in regardless as one wire then anything pigtailed is extra?

I want to have minimal wire in there to eliminate any potential shorts. Although I would recommend at least 6" there as well. The pigtails can be any length you want. Professionals often prefer this method because it isolates issues, protecting downstream circuits from cascading failures. Why does this matter?

this.

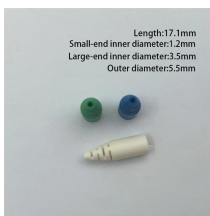
How to Make a Pigtail Wire The National Electric Code requires a pigtail wire to be least six inches long. Electricians often cut their own pigtails from scrap wire, but green grounding pigtails ...



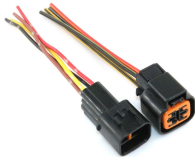
The wire coming in to the box should be at least 6 inches from the sheeting and then the additional 3 inches outside the opening. You can't by code cut that 6 inches into two 3inch wires making 6 inches.



I'm not sure there is a requirement on the pigtails once they are attached to the circuit conductors. Although I would recommend at least 6" there as well. The pigtails can be any length you ...



By "pigtail," I mean the extra wire you add to a splice (with a wirenut in my case) in order to connect a switch, lampholder, or receptacle into a circuit. Usually the pigtail is bared at the end, ...



Pigtails are common in outlet and switch wiring, particularly where there are more than one or two sets of conductors in the electrical box, and the installer doesn't want to rely on the device ...
